GOVERNING BOARD ORGANIZATION

LEGISLATIVE SESSION 2010 – PRIORITY ASK

- Given the current and projected economic constraints of state government and the decades-long trend of declining state support for public baccalaureate institutions, Regents and Trustees need every tool available to manage the affairs of our college and universities through this crisis and beyond.
- Will you support legislation that provides governing boards that seek it with tuition flexibility so that we can manage all of our resources?
- As part of this authority, our institutions will continue to make financial aid a priority to provide our students with affordable access and opportunity. Will you support full state funding for the State Need Grant and State Work Study program?

Trustee Talking Points

State Support

- Washington has dramatically shifted the financial burden of earning a bachelor's degree from the state to our students and families. In FY2000, state support for our public baccalaureate institutions was 72% of operating revenue. Today, **state support represents less than half of the operating revenue at four of our six institutions.**
- The Governor's 2010 Supplemental Budget proposal reduces state-per-FTE funding to below 1991 levels. **This would roll back state funding per student 20 years.**
- Most of the reductions in state support for our baccalaureate institutions occurred during a period when state spending in Washington grew by \$8.9 billion (2001-03 to 2009-11).

Tuition Setting Flexibility

- The Boards of Regents and Trustees at our public baccalaureate institutions have responsibly used the authority granted to them to set tuition rates since 2003 (for all groups of students except resident undergraduates).
- In most cases tuition rates grew more rapidly when set by the legislature than during the period when the authority has rested with the Boards of Regents and Trustees at our institutions.
- Regents and Trustees are entrusted with the stewardship of our institutions from every dimension, whether it is the delivery of education or ensuring our students' safety and welfare. Decisions on tuition will be afforded the same high level of consideration, especially as those decisions impact our students.

Financial Aid

- State financial aid is an essential element in providing access and opportunity for students in our state.
- The proposed cuts to financial aid would reverse the long commitment to our students and their families and would end Washington's standing as one of the best states in the nation at providing grant aid to students.


Biennial comparison of tuition revenue to state subsidy (2007-09 biennium compared to 2009-11).

State Support Compared to Tuition, 2007-09 and 2009-11


2007-09 Biennium


State funds have been replaced with tuition at Washington State 4-year baccalaureate institutions.

IPD Adjusted State Biennial Funding Per Budgeted FTE for Higher Education as Compared to IPD Adjusted Tuition Revenue per FTE


FY 1990 Dollars, Average Biennial Budgeted FTE Student Enrollment, Near General Fund-State, Biennia with Recessions Shaded

FY 1990 Dollars, Average Biennial Budgeted FTE Student Enrollment, Near General Fund-State, Biennia with Recessions Shaded





Washington's Success Story

Through the guidance of the legislature and the determined efforts of our higher education institutions over the last two decades, our public baccalaureate sector is now one of the most productive and efficient in the nation- despite being one of the least state funded. Washington's public baccalaureate institutions have demonstrated continual improvements in degree completion and productivity, making Washington one of the best performing states in the country in producing degrees relative to state investments. (*Kelly, 2009*)

- Washington's comprehensive institutions, and Evergreen, were rated number one in the nation in completion and degree productivity relative to funding per FTE. (*Kelly and Jones, 2005*)
- Our public research institutions award more bachelor's degrees per FTE student than research institutions in any other state.
- Washington is 2nd in the nation in degree productivity at the graduate level. (*IPEDS*)
- Our freshmen retention rate is among the highest in the nation. (*IPEDS*)
- Our six-year graduation rate for first-time freshmen ranks 3rd in the nation and has improved by 9% in the last decade. This means 1,350 more of the freshmen class entering our campuses today will earn bachelor's degrees than they would have 10 years ago. (*IPEDS*)



Bachelor's degrees, 2005-06, per 100 undergraduate students, Fall 2005, public baccalaureate institutions



Washington ranks 3rd in degree completion at public baccalaureate institutions


Percent of Fall 2001 freshman cohort graduating with a bachelor's degree within 6 years, public institutions




Washington's 4-Year Public College and Universities are an Excellent Return on the State's Investment


Washington experienced the steepest percentage decline in the nation in higher education revenues per FTE student (state and local support plus tuition in constant dollars) from 1991 to 2005.

Washington ranked 46th in the nation in total higher education funding per FTE student in 2006-2007.

Washington is 5th in public 2-year higher education participation


Public 2-year participation rates based on the population age 17-64, Fall 2005


